Assignments and journal entries (40%), exam grades (25%), class participation (25%) and a concert review project (20%).

LATE WORK

I will only accept late submissions with a valid excuse. If the assignment is turned in late, the grade will be reduced by 10%. I will not accept any assignments or exams more than 1 week late.

EXAMS

There will be 4 exams this semester.

Each exam is worth 6.25% of the final grade average. Exam materials will be drawn from text readings, supplemental material and listening examples. Exam dates will be listed in the course calendar and in the weekly folder descriptions.

Exams will be taken in class (unless otherwise specified) and will not be made up unless a valid excuse is presented. Failure to complete the exams during the announced exam dates will result in a grade of zero.

CONCERT REVIEW PROJECT

This project is worth 20% of the final average and is due at the end of WEEK 15.

The student will fully attend ONE **LIVE, approved Classical** concert and then write a **two page, typed, double-spaced, 12 point font paper.**

The content of the paper should be focused on evaluating and reacting to the experience and the music, not just a listing of compositions and performers.

The performance must be approved by the instructor.

Projects which do not follow the above requirements will not receive credit.

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
