Foreign Language Requirements

Students who pursue a Bachelor of Arts at SHSU will be required to complete 14 hours of foreign language. Students can take SPAN1411, SPAN1412, SPAN2311, and SPAN2312 to satisfy this requirement. SPAN2311 will satisfy the 040 Language, Philosophy, and Culture core.

Students who pursue a Bachelor of Science at SHSU will not be required to complete 14 hours of foreign language. Please visit their catalog for current information:

SPC American History Core Component – 060 Options

Additional options are available to complete the American History Core. *Instead of HIST1301, students can take HST2327 – Mexican American History I, HIST2381 – African American History I, or *HIST2301 – Texas History. For HIST1302, students can take HIST2328 – Mexican American History II, HIST2382 – African American History II, or *HIST2301 – Texas History.* Texas History can be used one time to fulfill three of the six hours required.

TSI-Compliance

Students who are not TSI-compliant in reading or English are advised to take the INRW0300/ENGL1301 corequisite. Successful completion will grant TSI-compliance in these areas and college-credit for ENGL1301. ENGL1302 requires a 'C' or better in the corequisite or approval by the English Chairperson.

Students who are not TSI-compliant in math are advised to take the MATH0332/MATH1332 corequisite. Successful completion will grant TSI-compliance in math and college-credit for MATH1332.

SHSU Steps to Apply for Admission

Step 1: Complete the Online Application for SHSU

Complete an online application and pay the \$50 non-refundable application fee.

Alternatively, you may pay later by mailing a check (address below) or pay through the <u>SHSU Self Service Center</u>. Qualifying students may submit an application fee waiver request to SHSU Office of Admissions via email at <u>admissions@shsu.edu</u>. Applicants must include the required supporting documents to request a fee waiver:

• a copy of the first page of your Student Aid Report (FAFSA).

Step 2: Submit Your Transcripts

SHSU requires transcripts from all institutions where you have enrolled in a course or courses, even if you did not attend or the course was not completed. Contact the school(s) to send official transcript(s) to SHSU.*

- Or ask your school to send an electronic official transcript to Sam Houston State University (code: 003606).
- If transcripts are from a school outside of the U.S., the document must be translated and evaluated by a <u>NACES</u> accredited service or <u>SDR Educational Consultants</u>. International college transcript evaluations must include a course by course evaluation.
- Please note that SHSU does not accept fax or emailed transcripts.

*Transcripts and other supporting documents will be retained by the university for 6 months.

Applicable Transfer Credit Hours

All courses and grades transferred from other institutions accredited by an agency recognized by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board are recorded as received on the student's academic record at SHSU; however, not all transfer course work will satisfy degree requirements. Evaluation of course credit earned at other institutions by SHSU's Admission's Office does not decree approval of the credit for use towards degree requirements. Only the academic department chair offering the program in which a student is enrolled has authority for determining which courses will be applied toward any specific program. Applicants must submit official records from all accredited institutions attended. Official transcripts must be sent directly to the Office of Admissions. While all credit hours presented on the sending institution's transcripts will be evaluated and equivalent college level courses posted to the student's academic record, Sam Houston State University accepts a maximum of 66 semester credit hours plus 4 hours of activity-based physical education (kinesiology) for a total of 70 semester credit hours from the accredited community colleges attended.

Admission to SHSU as a Transfer Student

A transfer student is defined as an undergraduate student who has completed a minimum of 12 hours of transferable academic coursework from a college and/or university accredited by an agency recognized by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board after high school graduation. Transferable academic coursework is defined as those attempted hours of coursework which are applicable to a baccalaureate degree program.

It is intended for advising purposes only so students know exactly which courses they can take at South Plains College and have the courses count towards degree requirements when they transfer to SHSU. It is highly recommended that students meet with their assigned academic advisor to review all graduation and transfer requirements listed in the Transfer Advising Guide.

The ultimate goal is to provide students with accurate information for transfer pathways while minimizing loss of credits in transfer. Students are encouraged to review SHSU requirements frequently.

Scholarships for Transfer Students

The following scholarships are awarded once you have: 1) been accepted for admission, 2) met the necessary criteria for the scholarship with official documentation and applied for financial aid through submission of the FAFSA. You will receive the largest scholarship for which you are qualified.

Bearkat Transfer Scholarship - \$2,000/yr up to 1 year (will no longer be offered after Spring 2025)

- First-time SHSU student, enrolling full-time at SHSU (must not have previously enrolled at SHSU)
- Transfer from an accredited community college or university
- Be an undergraduate student, seeking their first bachelor's degree
- Have a minimum of 30 transferable academic credit hours
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75
- The Bearkat Transfer scholarship is now a single year award without eligibility for renewal beginning Fall 2024
